

Itinerant Support Service Home-Based Learning for Students with Hearing Loss

TIPS TO ENHANCE ACCESSIBILITY

- 1) Teachers/parents/caregivers to be informed and mindful about the student's hearing loss condition. Build a safe online space for student's learning; you may wish to provide the permission upfront that students should inform promptly when they are unable to hear clearly.
- 2) State instructions clearly, in shorter sentences. Provide written instructions alongside as much as possible.
- 3) The use of FM system/Roger Inspiro (or any other accompaniment listening device recommended by doctor) to enhance the student's listening ability. Device can be directly plugged into laptop/computer via audio cable, or placed on another table in front of speaker.

- 4) Check in on the student's understanding occasionally. When checking in, ask simple open-ended questions to test understanding.
- 5) Use visuals and demonstration when doing verbal explanations.
- 6) When using video or auditory aids, choose materials with closed captions, subtitles or transcripts as far as possible.
- 7) During online discussions, ensure only one person is speaking at each time, with speaker's face in clear view. Ideally, speech can be accompanied
- 8) For students with unilateral loss, ensure that student's better ear is facing the source of sound.
- 9) Ensure that student's home set-up is away from noisy background noises like fan, roads, etc.
- Students with high levels of difficulties understanding online lessons can explore applying for notetaking services (<u>https://sadeaf.org.sg/service/notetaking/</u>).
